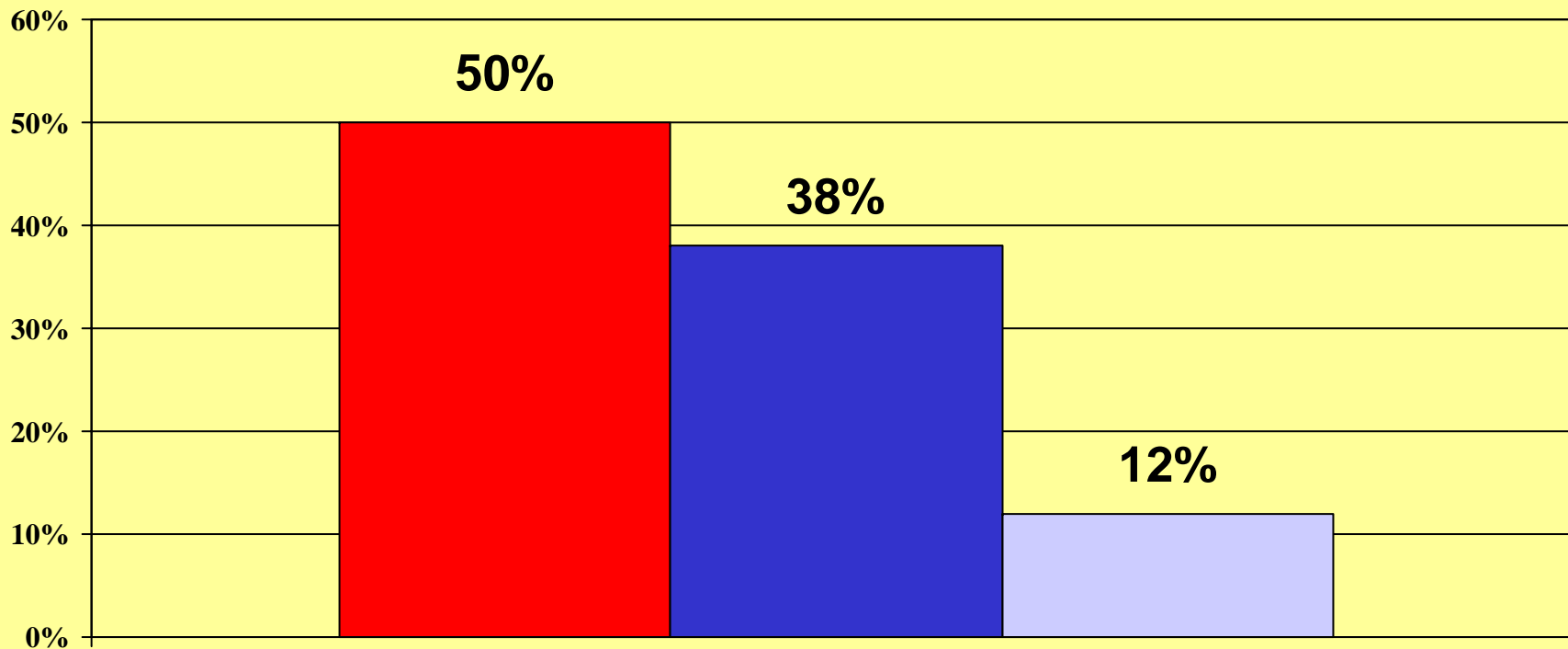

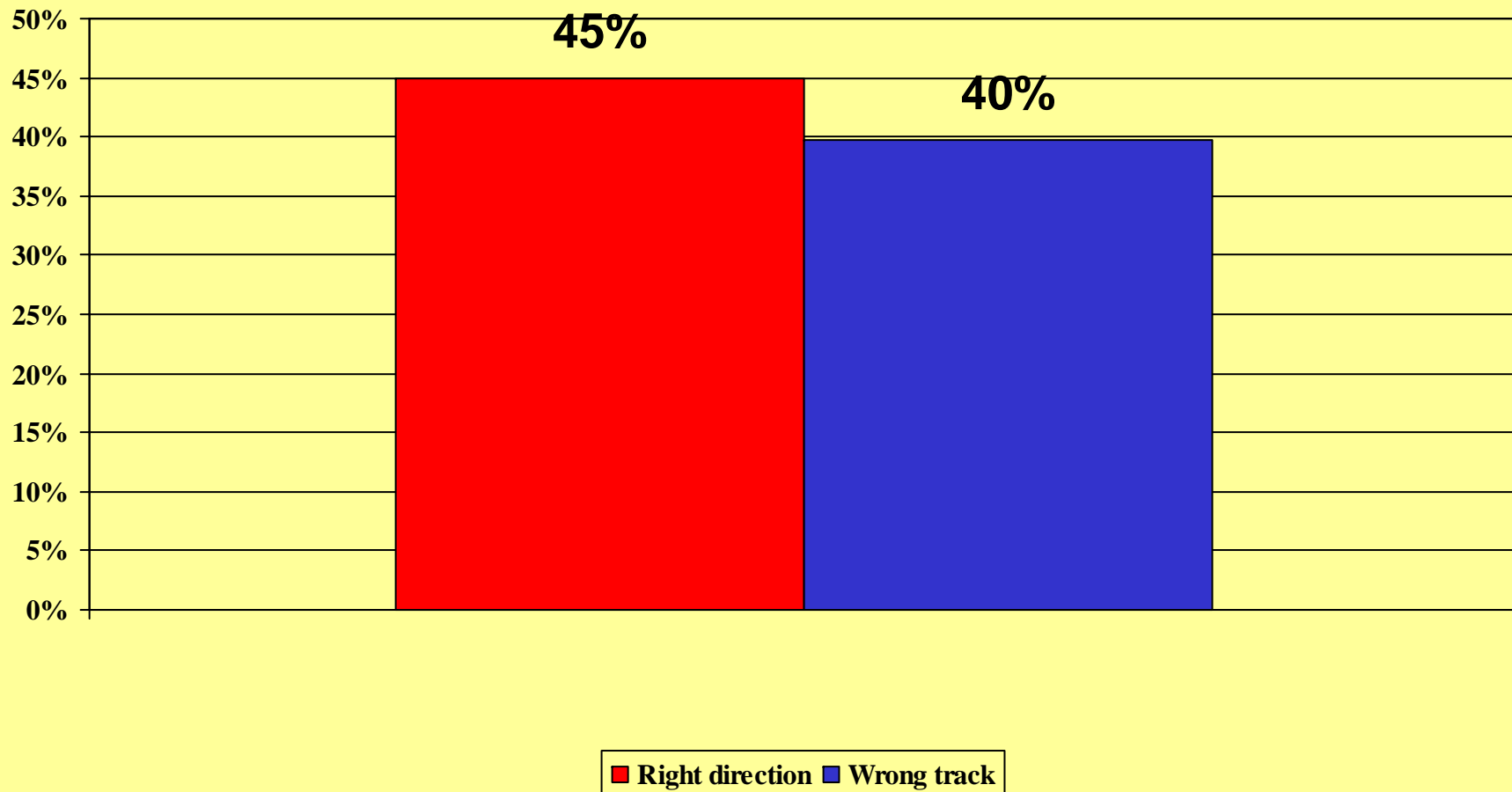

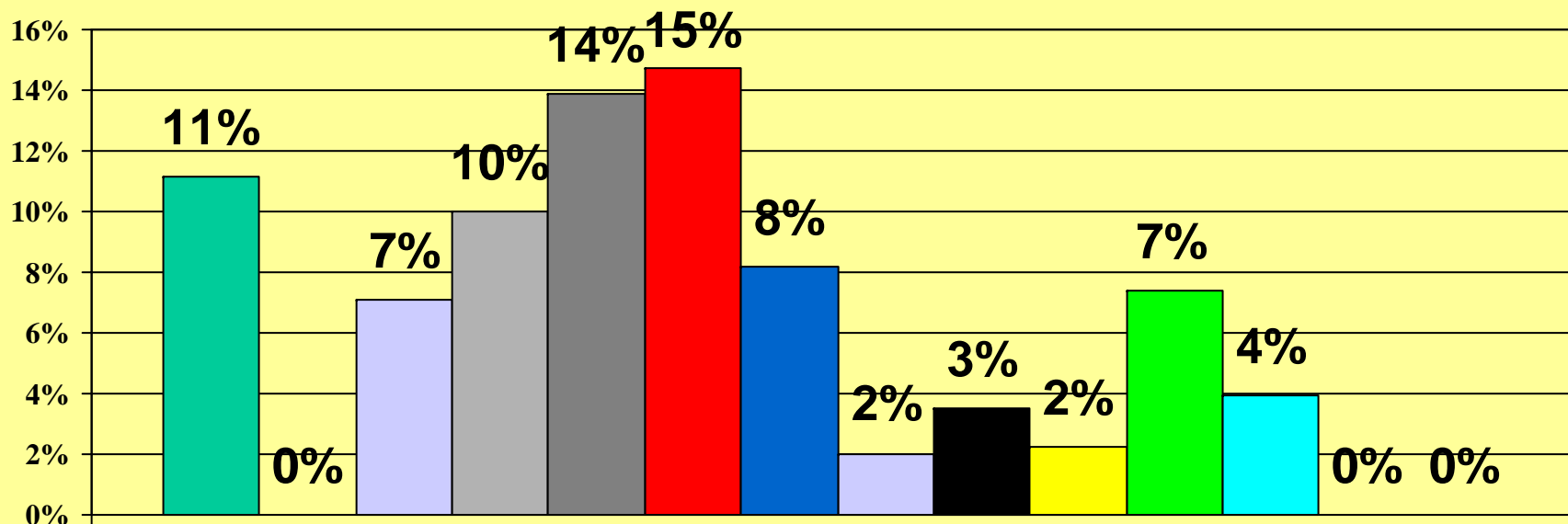

Do you feel things in North Carolina are generally headed in the right direction or have gotten off on the wrong track?

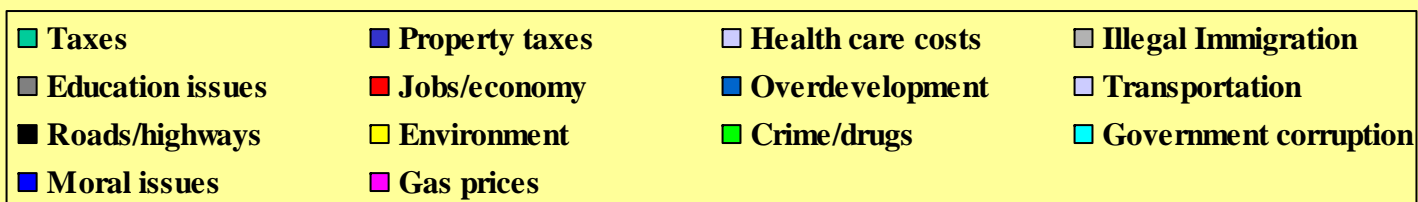

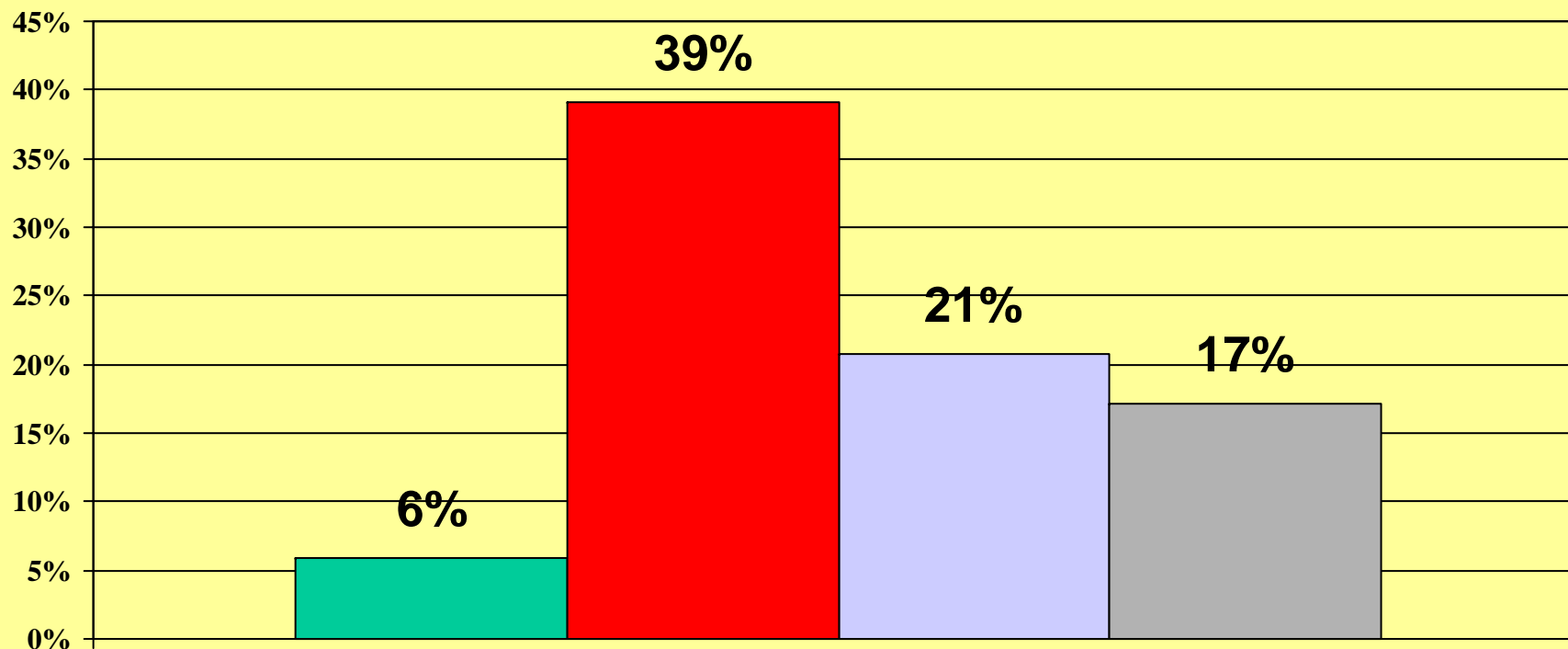

Do you approve or disapprove of the job the North Carolina Legislature is doing?

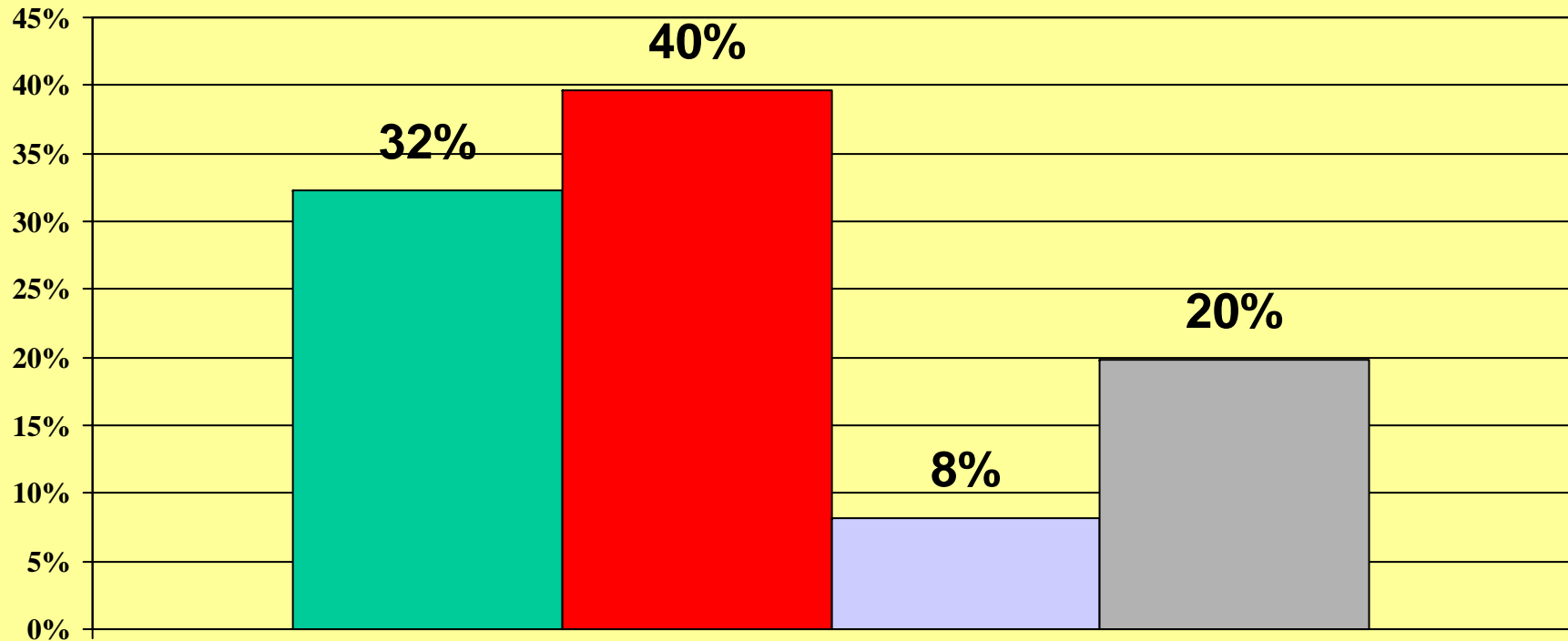

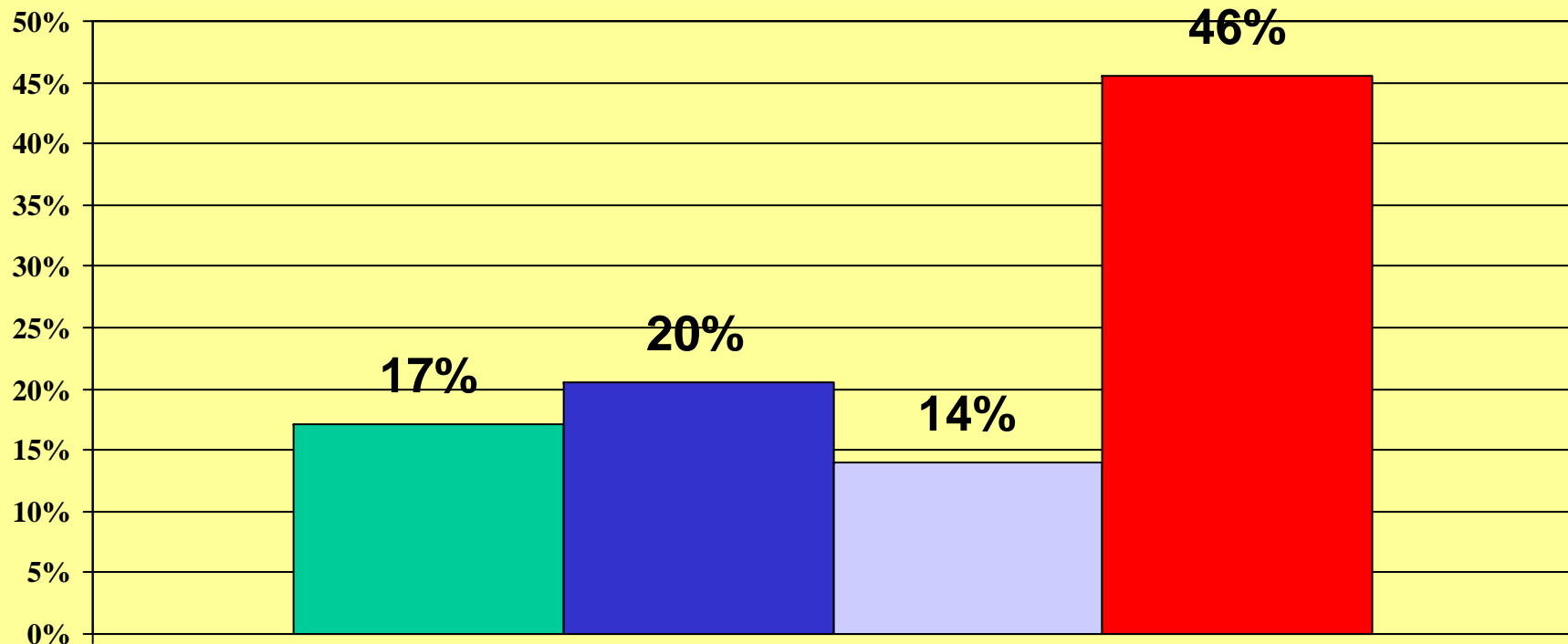

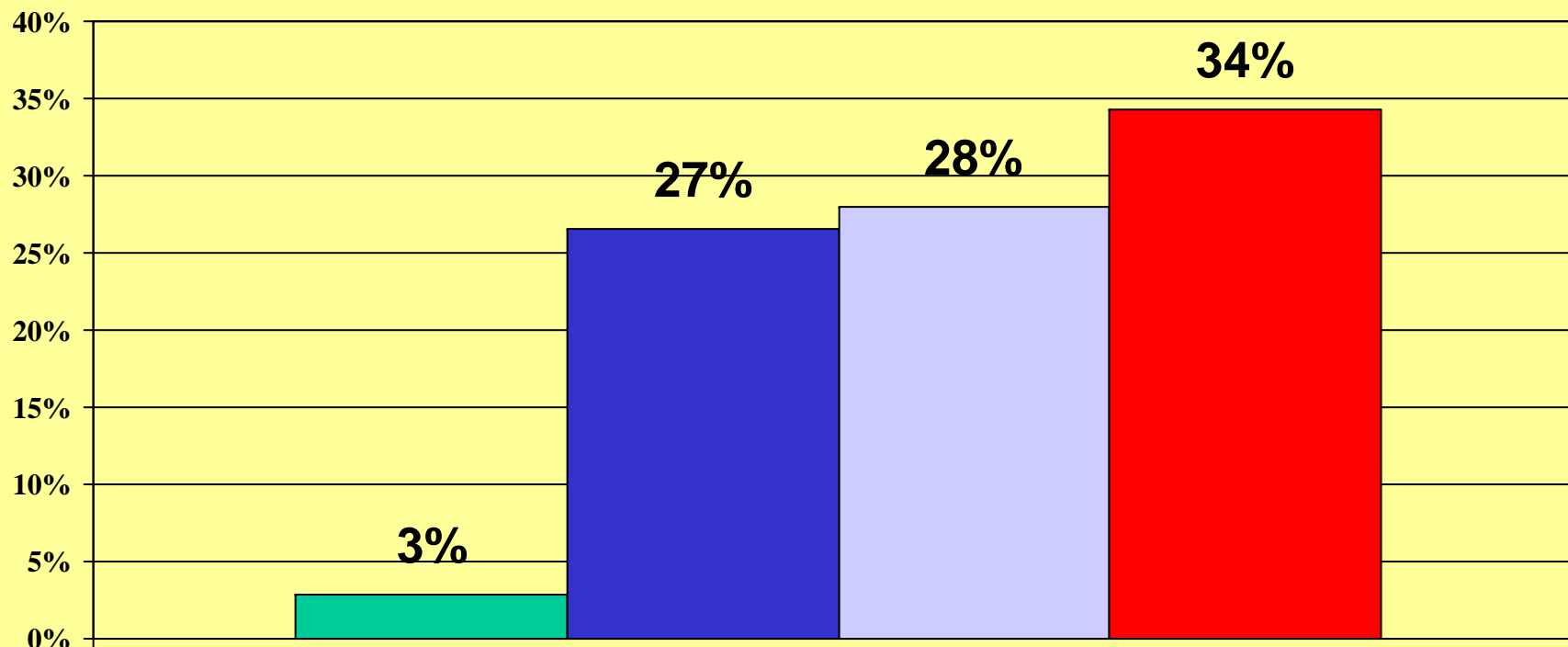

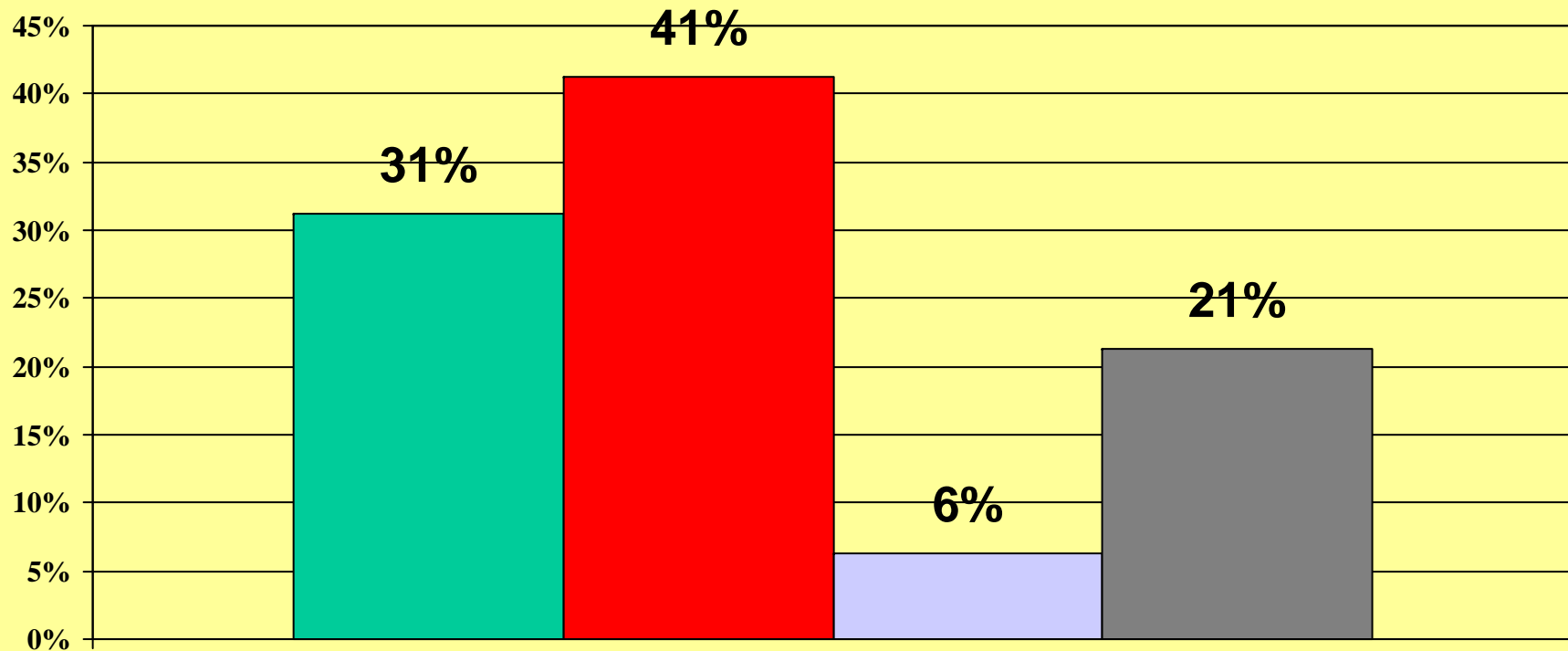

If the 2008 congressional elections were being held today, would you be voting:

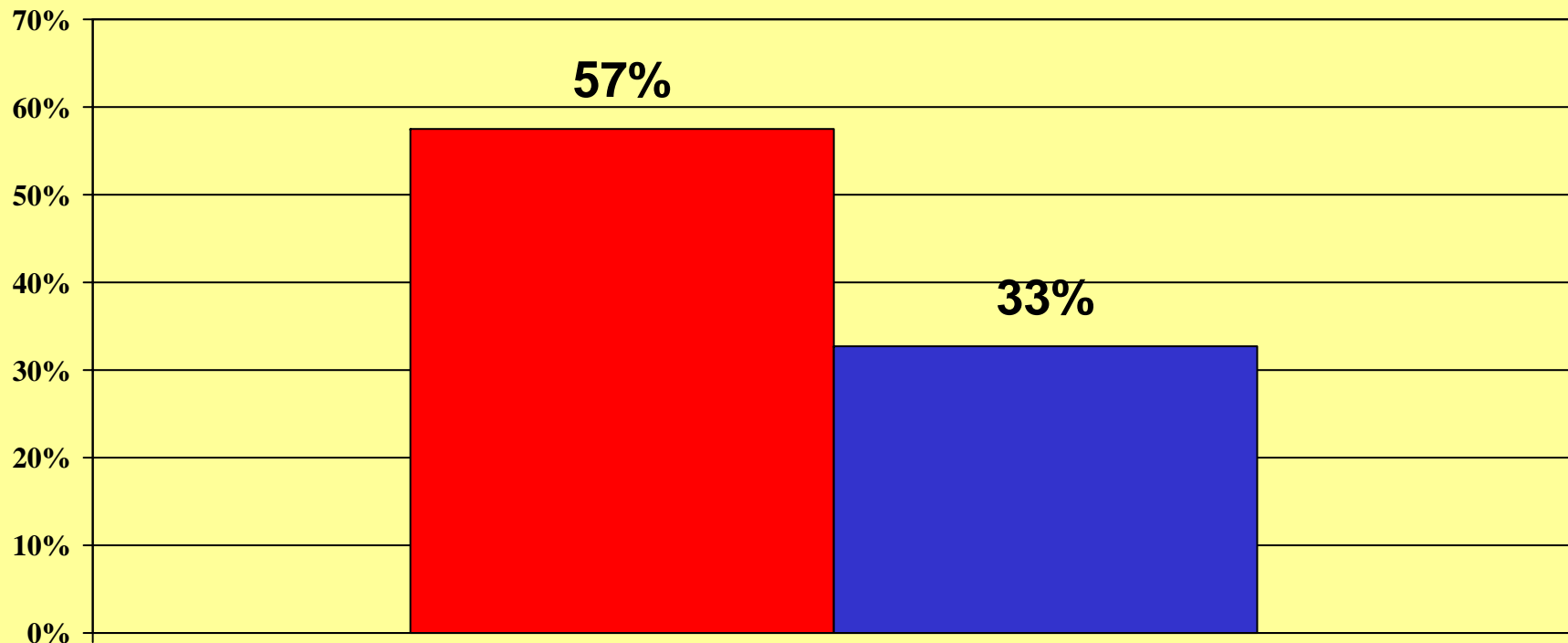

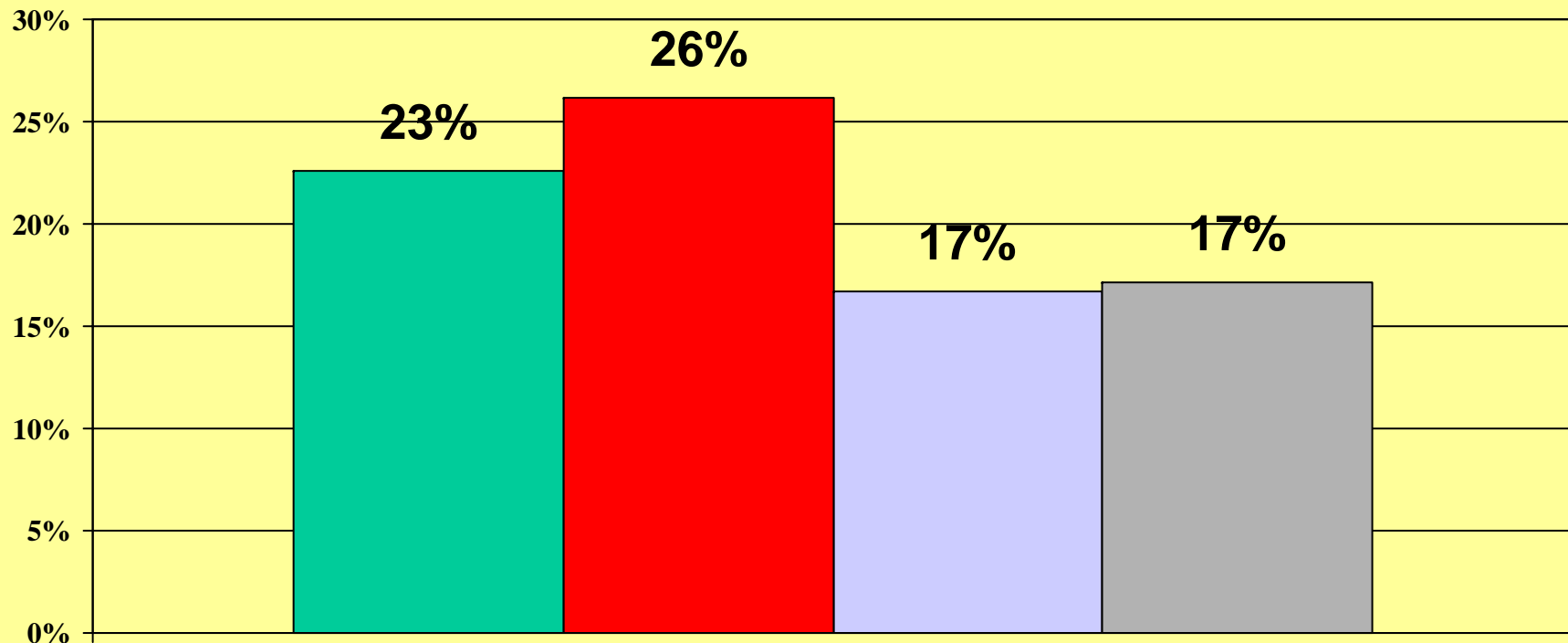

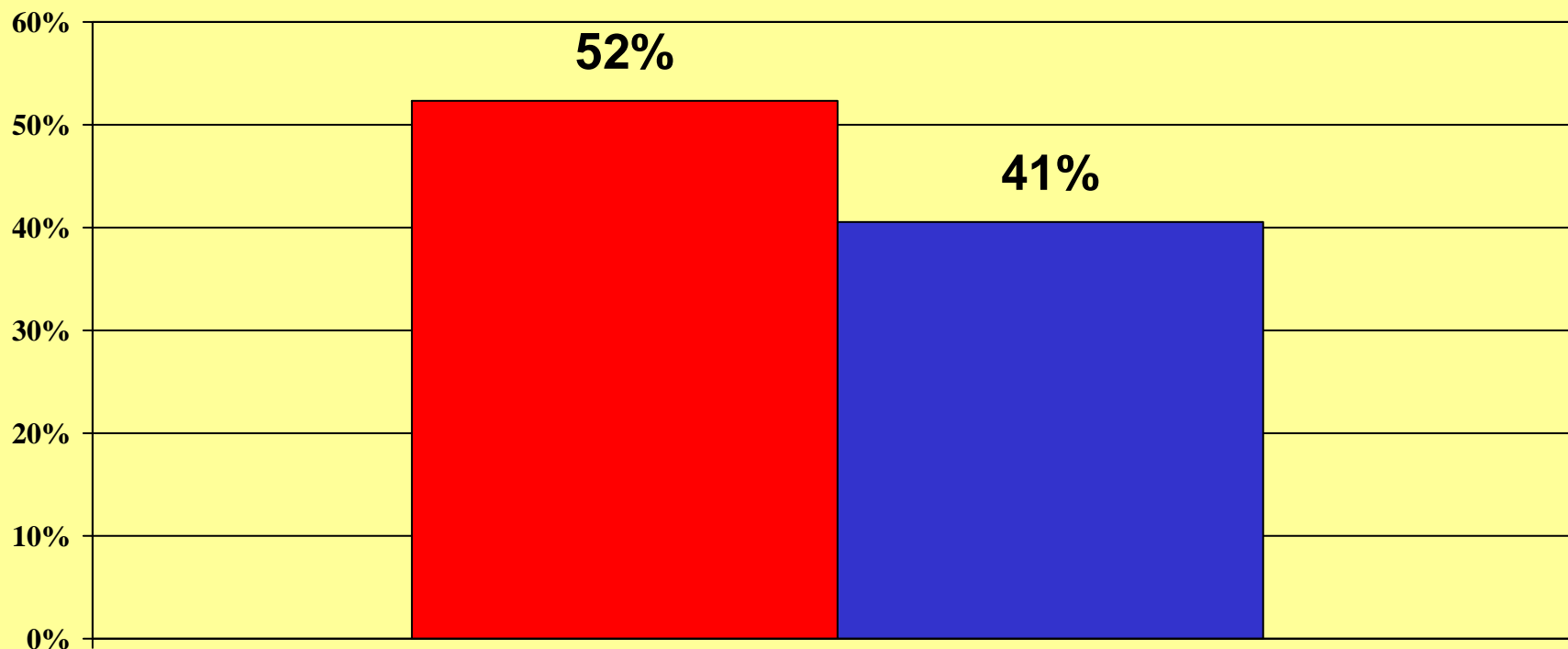

Do you feel strongly enough about Hilary Clinton that you would not vote for her regardless of who the Republican candidate was?

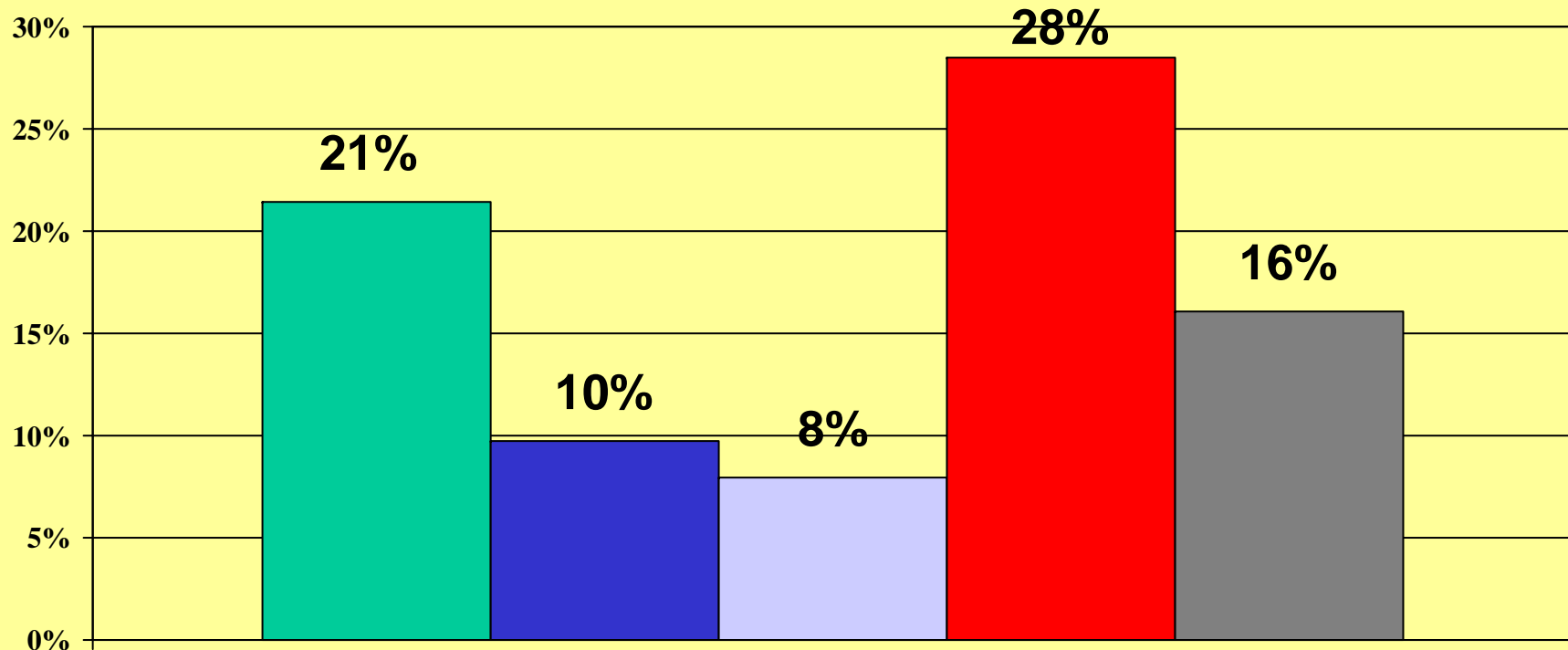

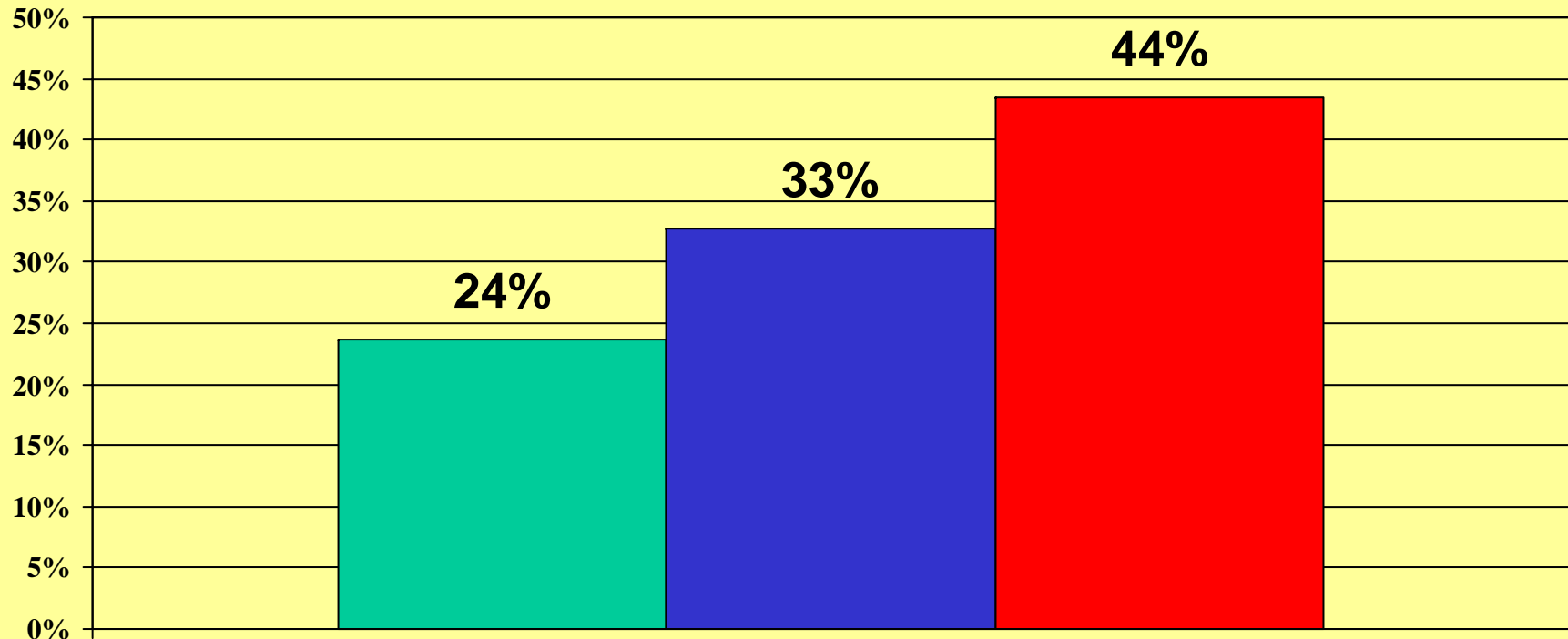

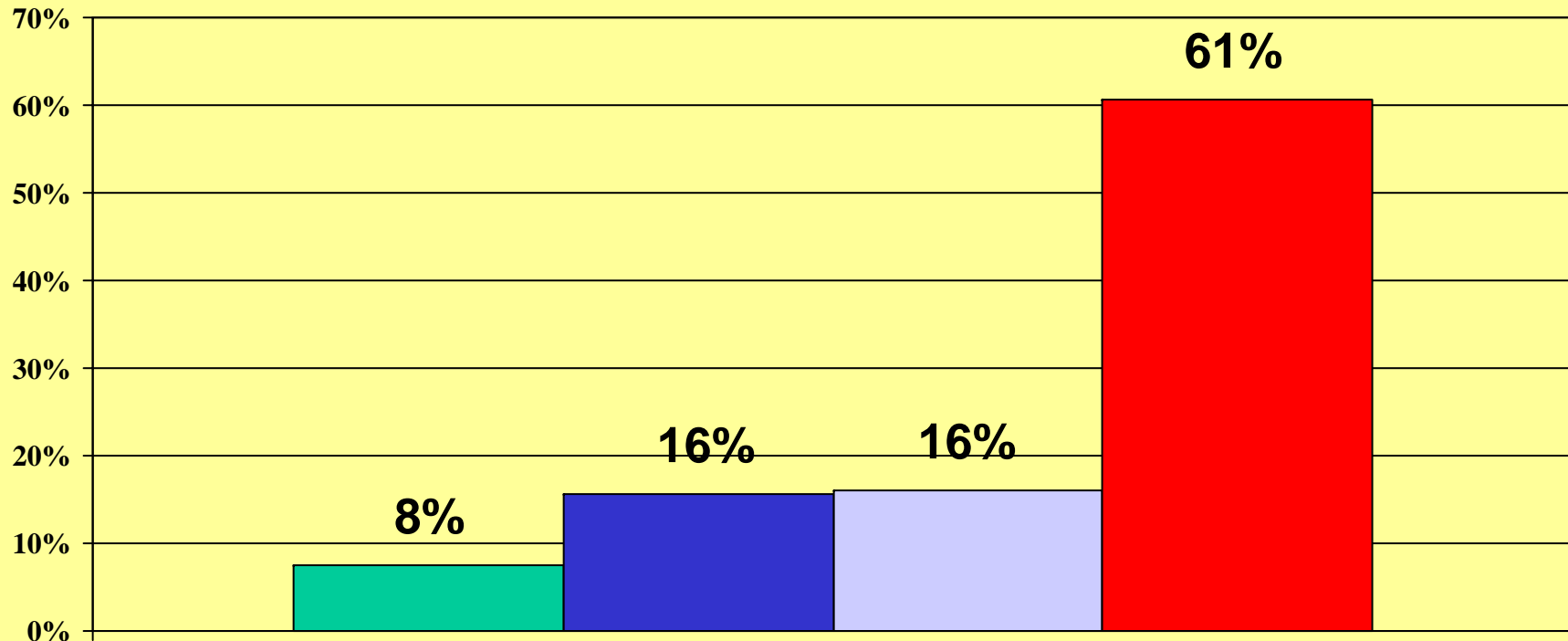

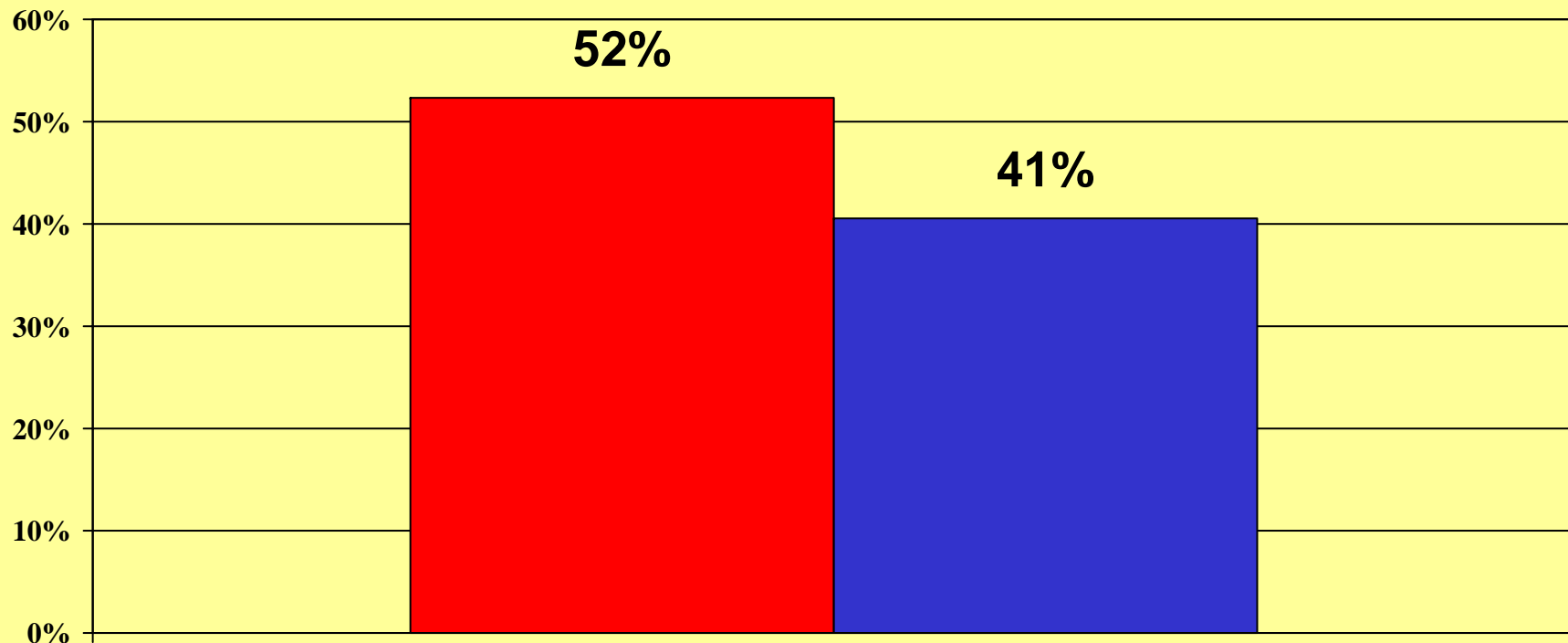

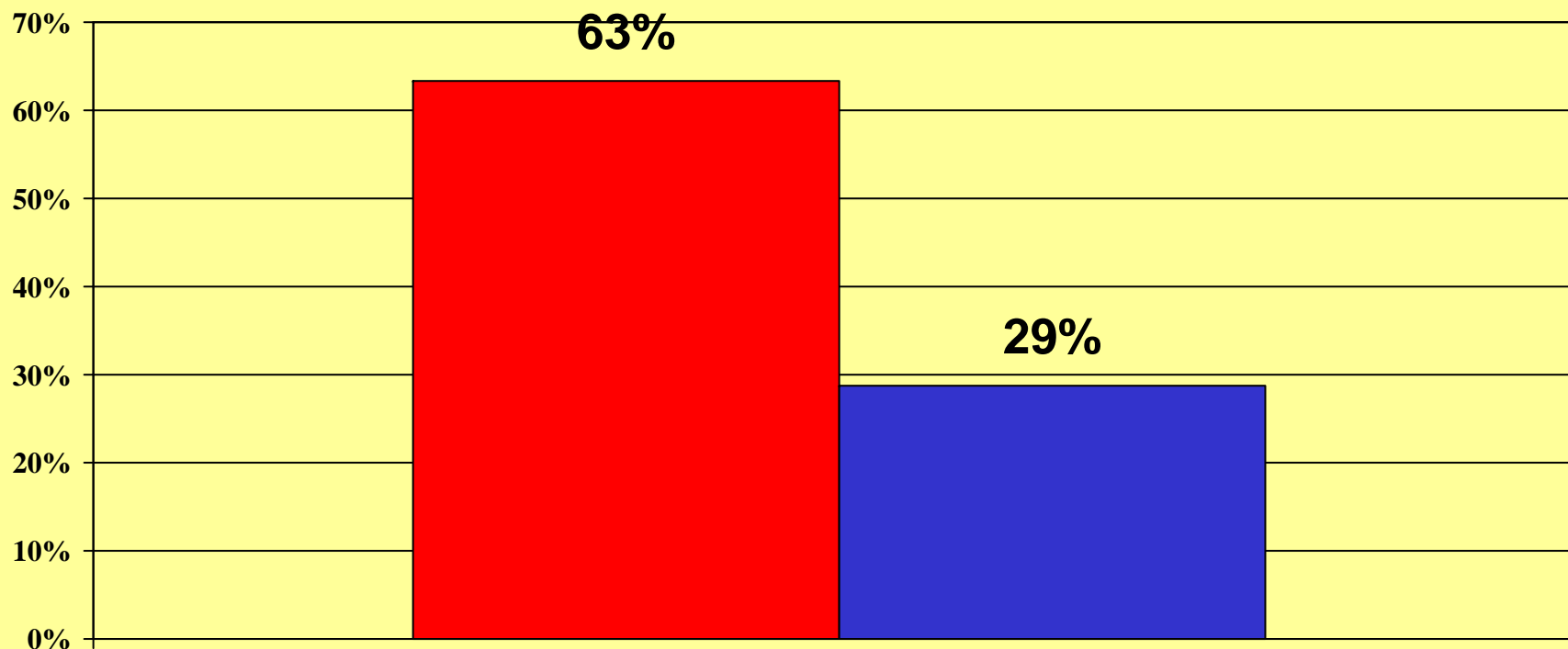

Do you believe global warming is a threat to North Carolinians?

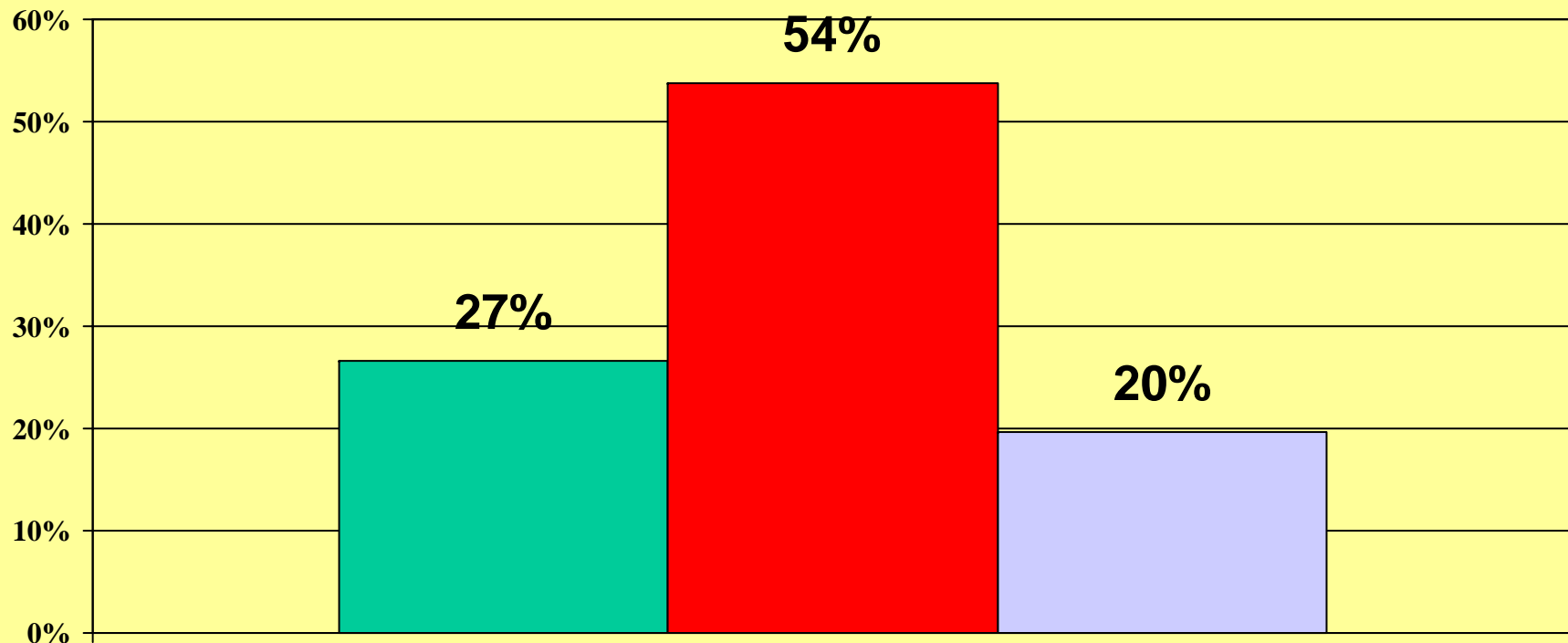

Do you think State government should enact new laws to control global warming in North Carolina or is it a problem that can best be solved through national and international action?

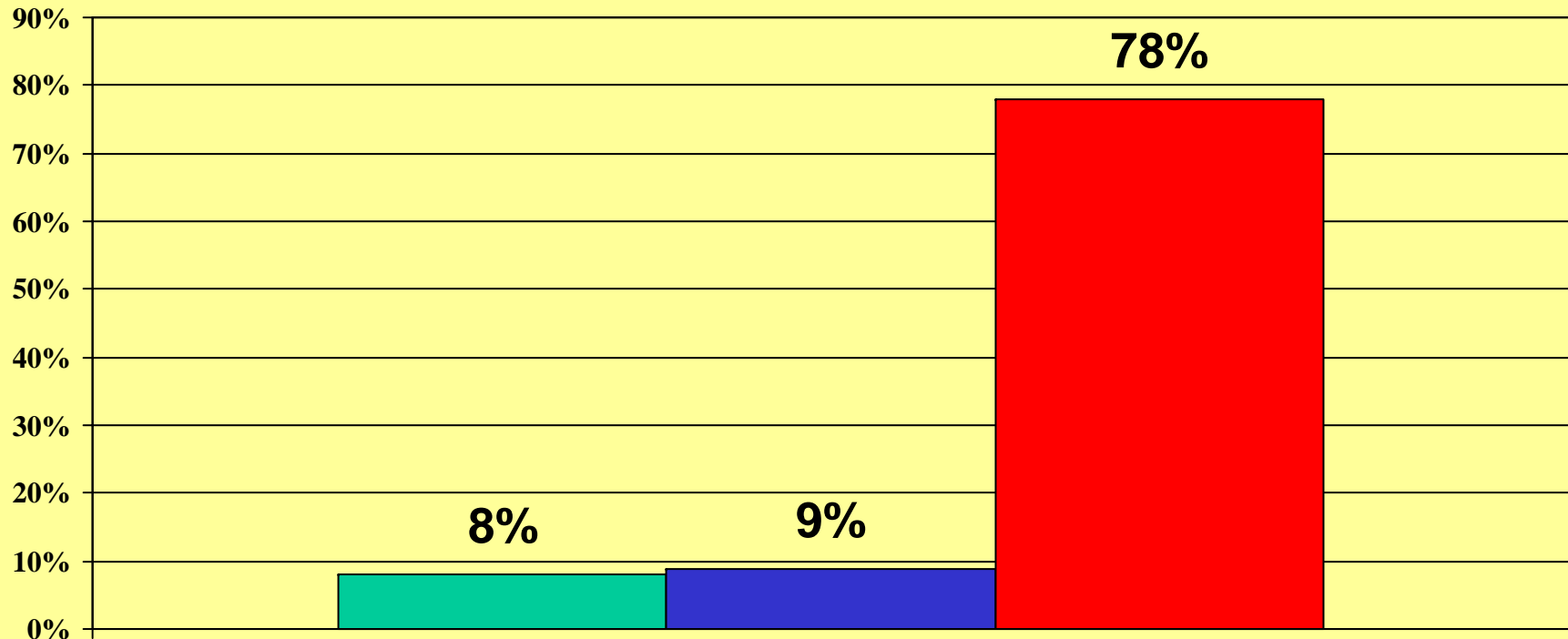

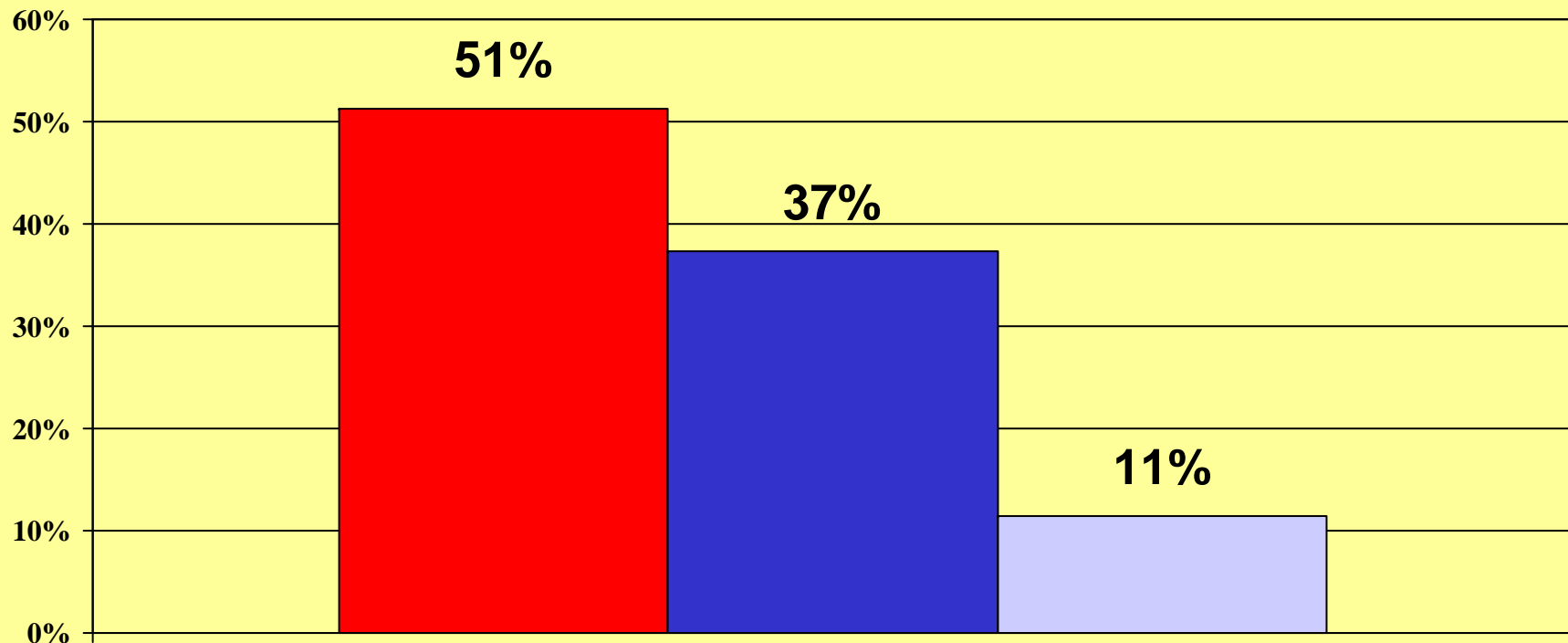

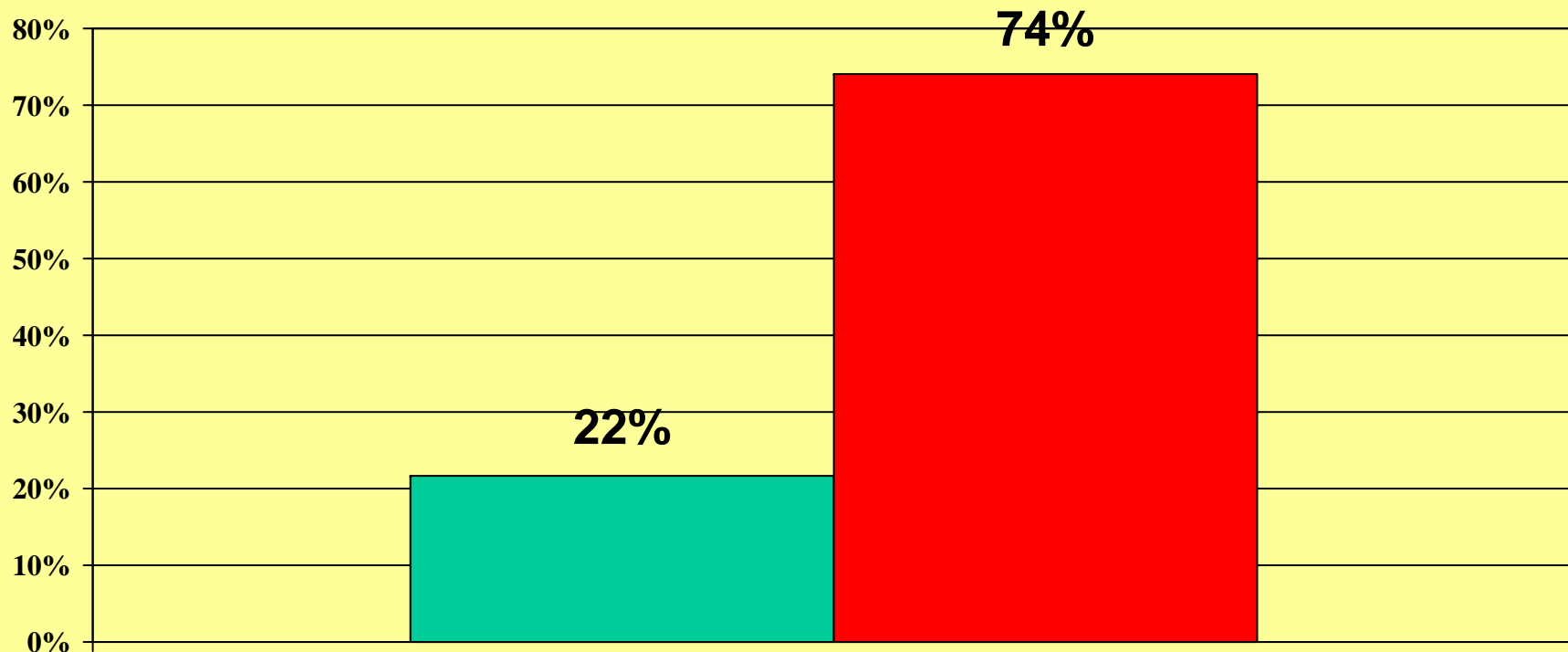

Would you support a State program that would provide clean needles to illegal drug users using taxpayer dollars?

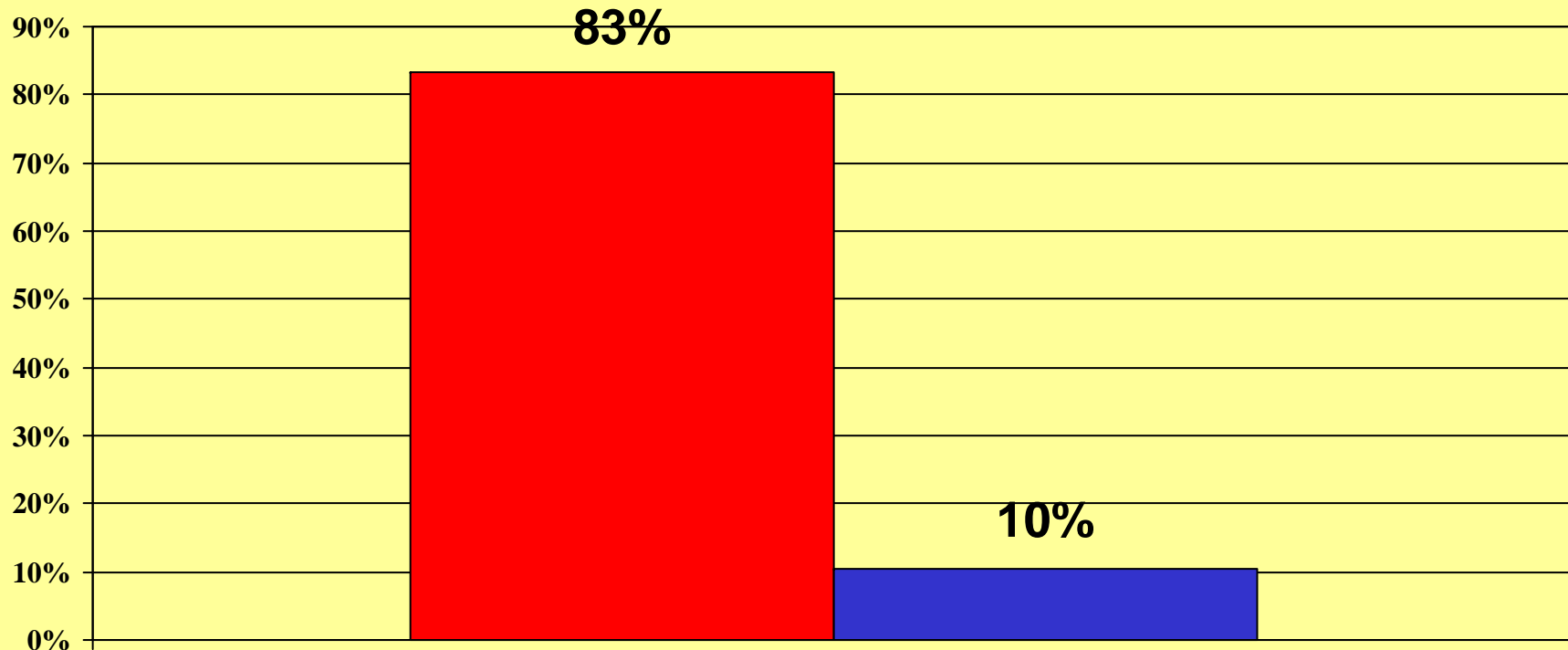

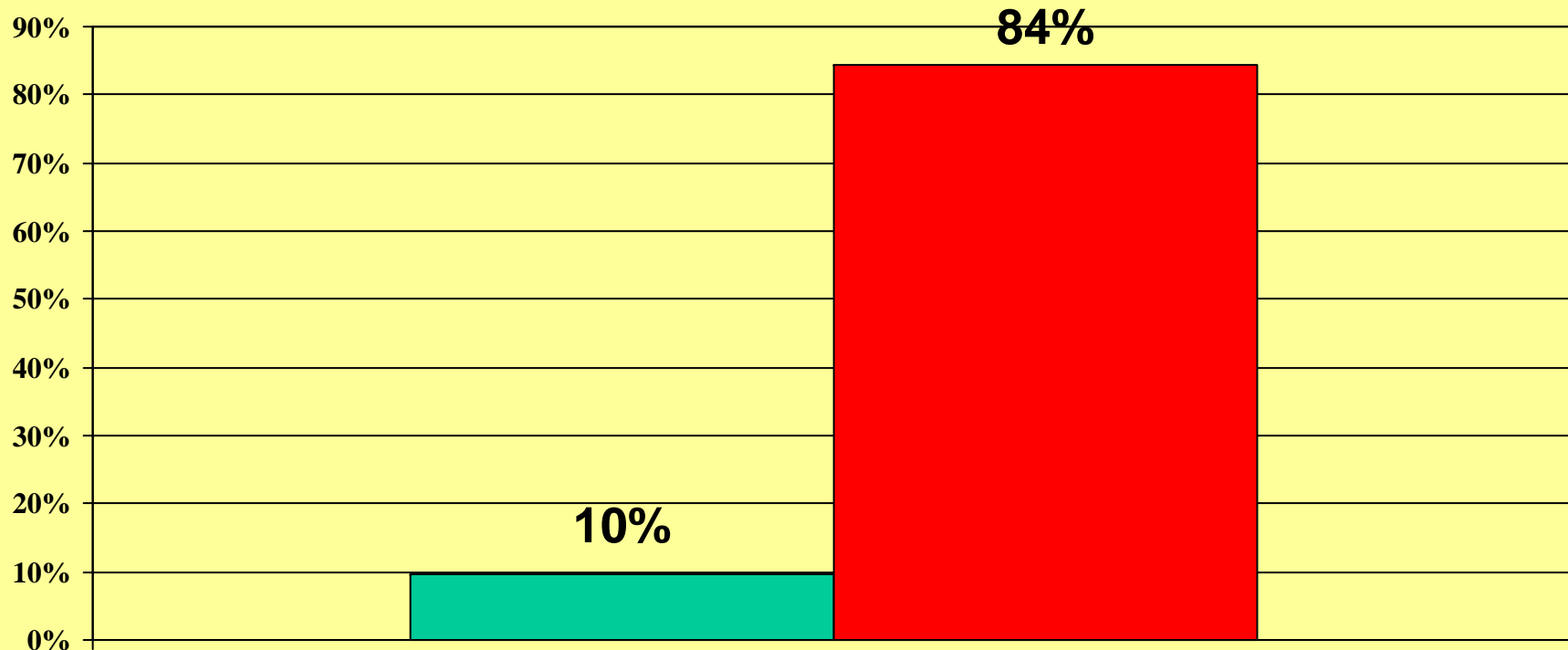

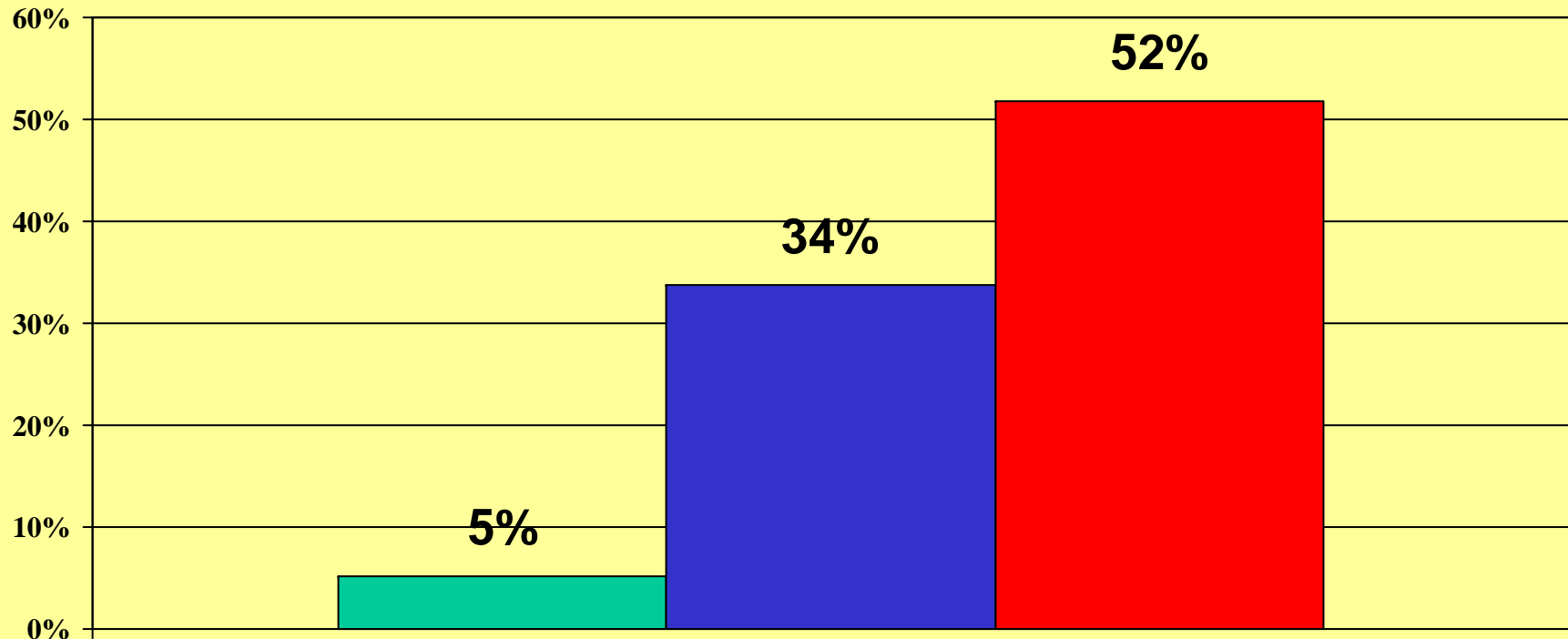

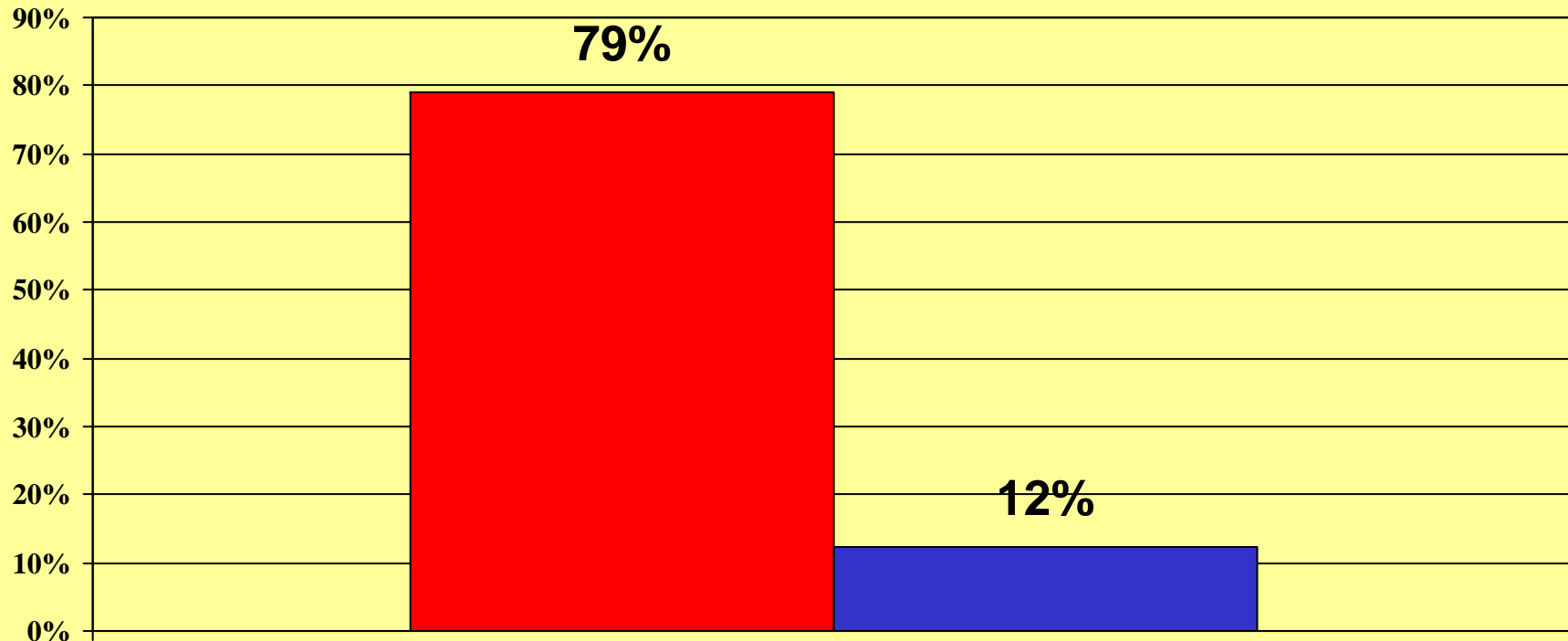

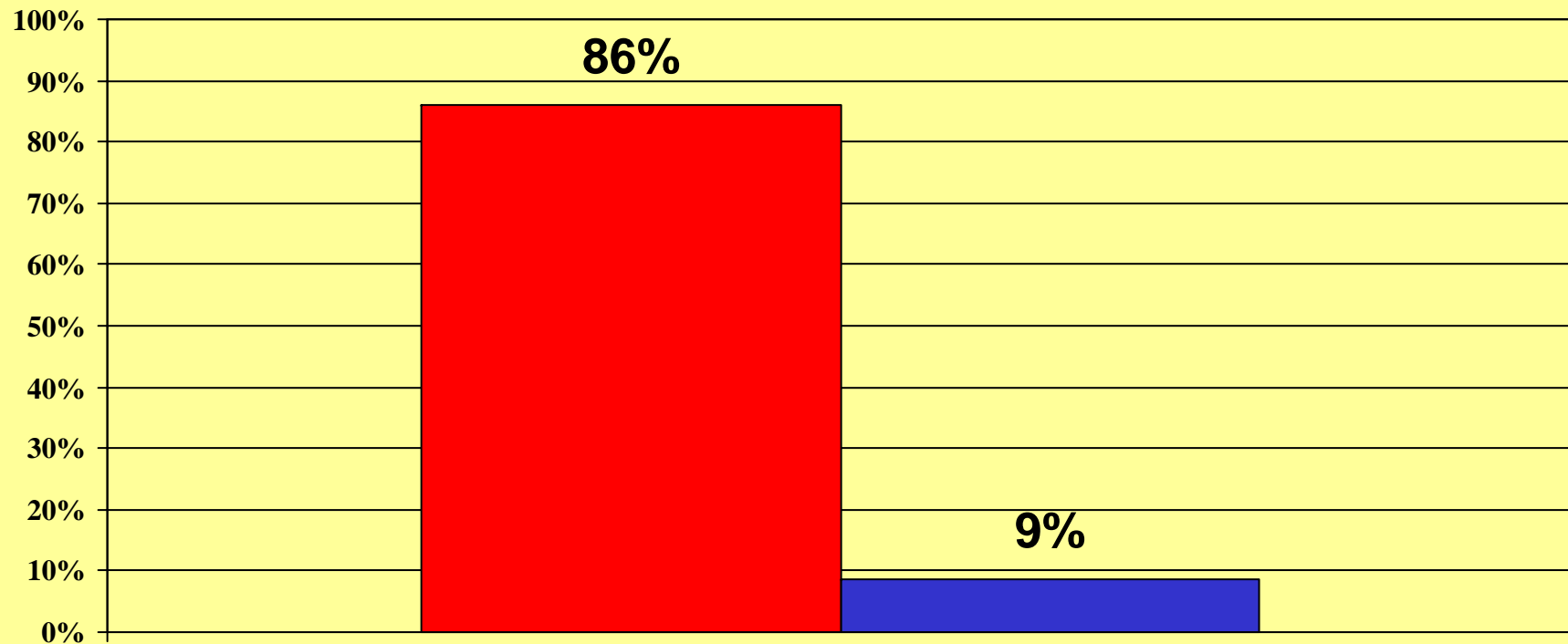

Do you support or oppose allowing North Carolina residents to buy health insurance from companies outside the state if policies in other states are less expensive?

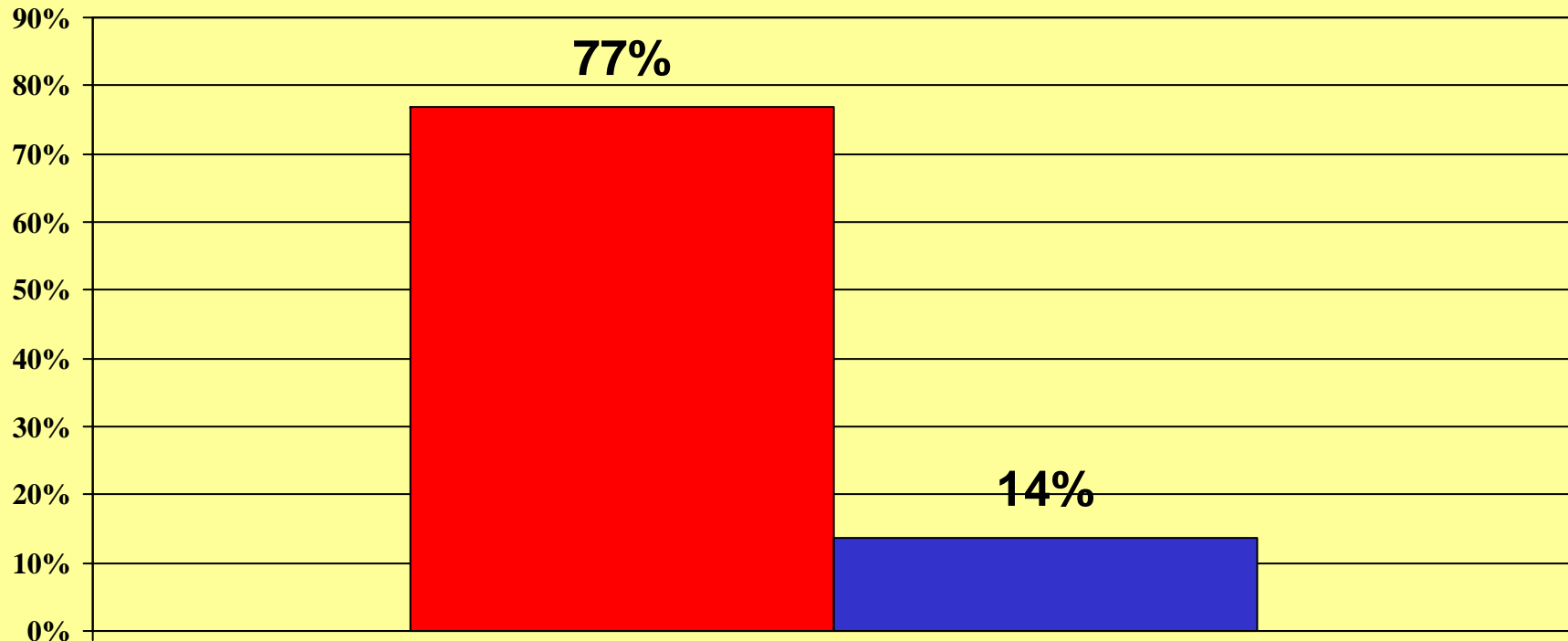

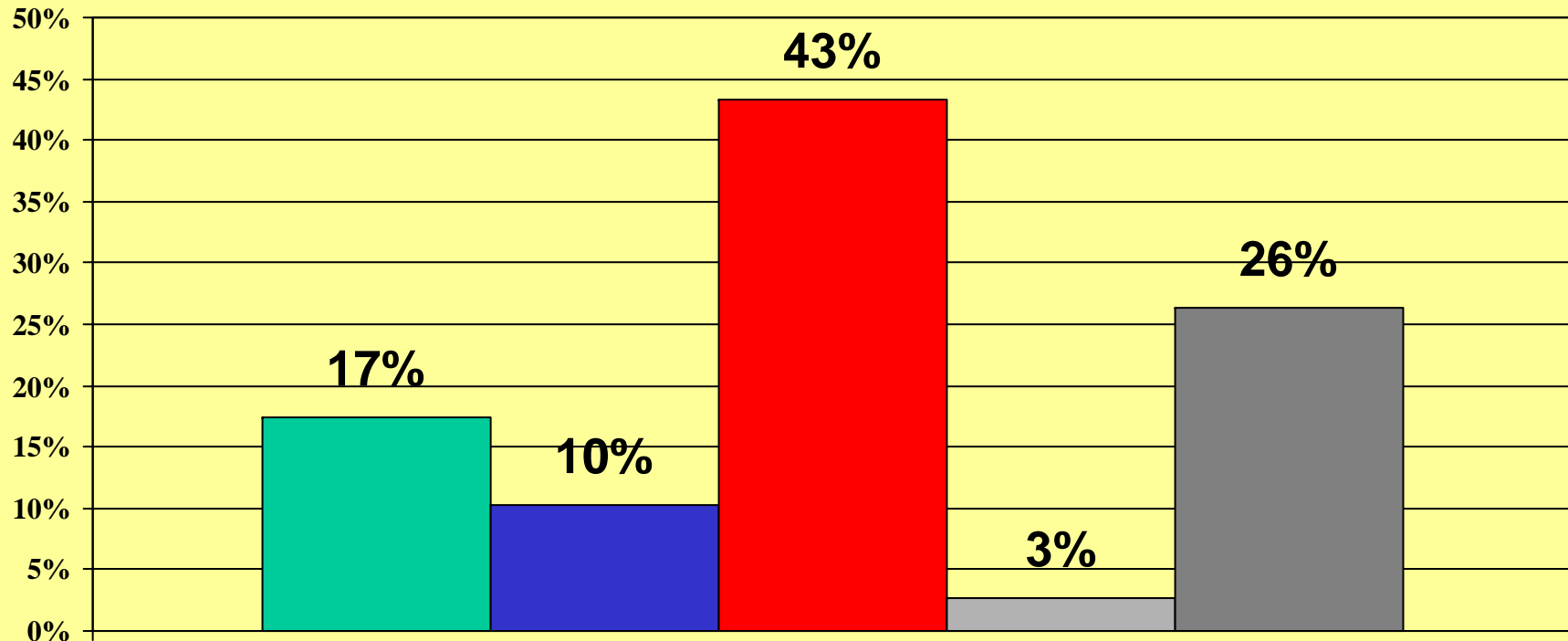

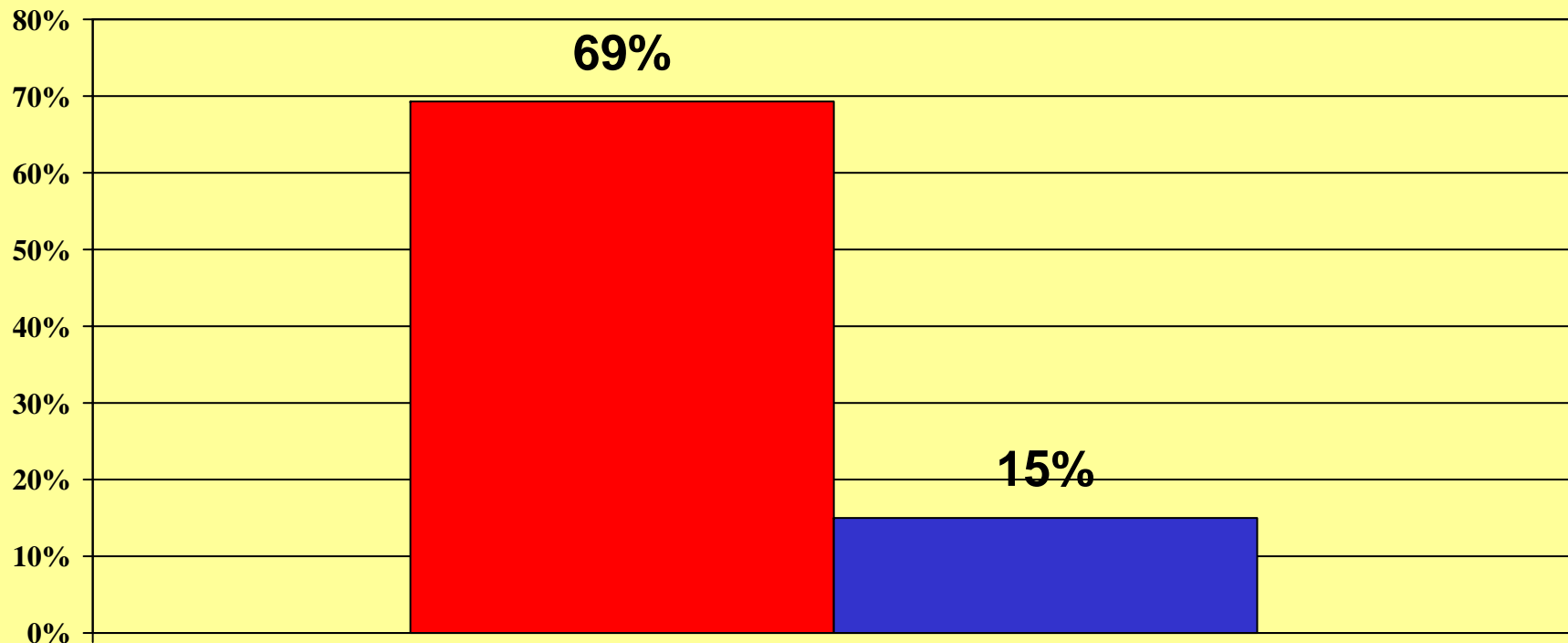

When you think about government today, would you prefer smaller government with fewer services and lower taxes or bigger government that provides more services with higher taxes?

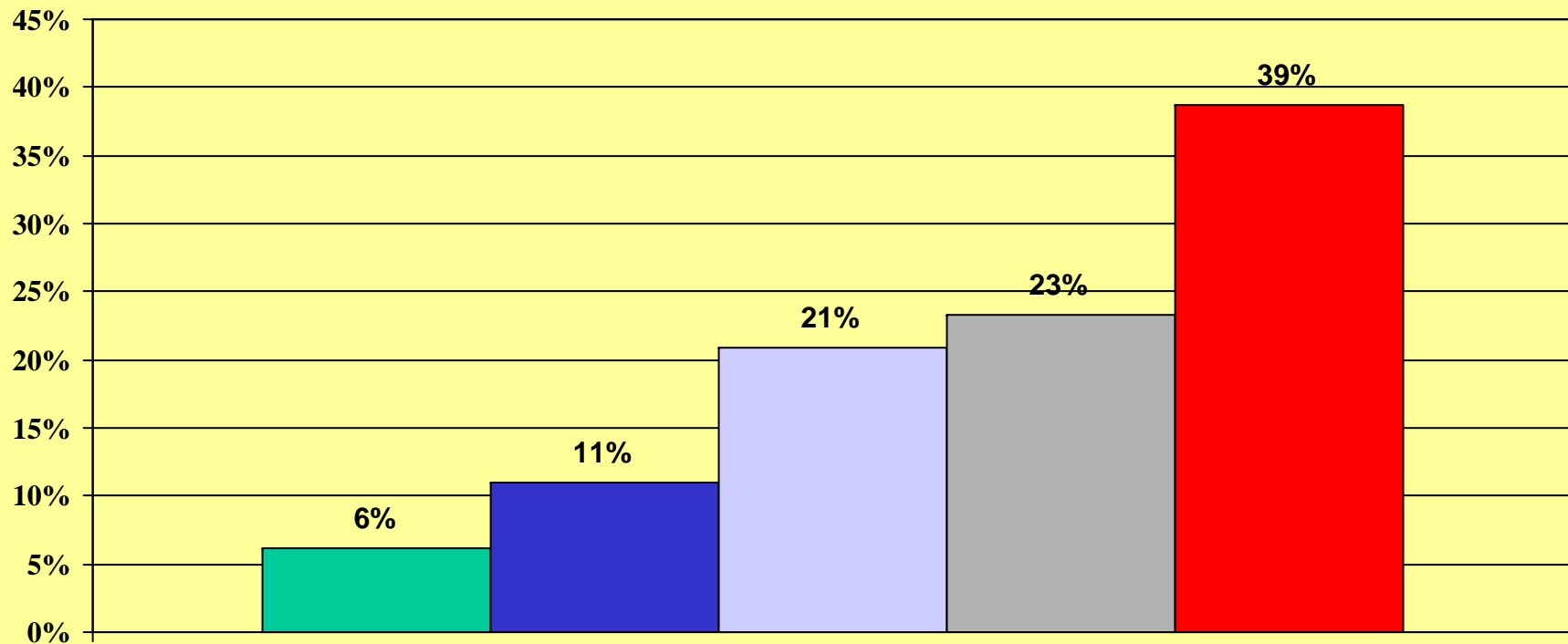

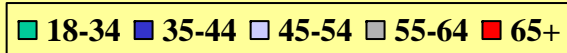

Age Group

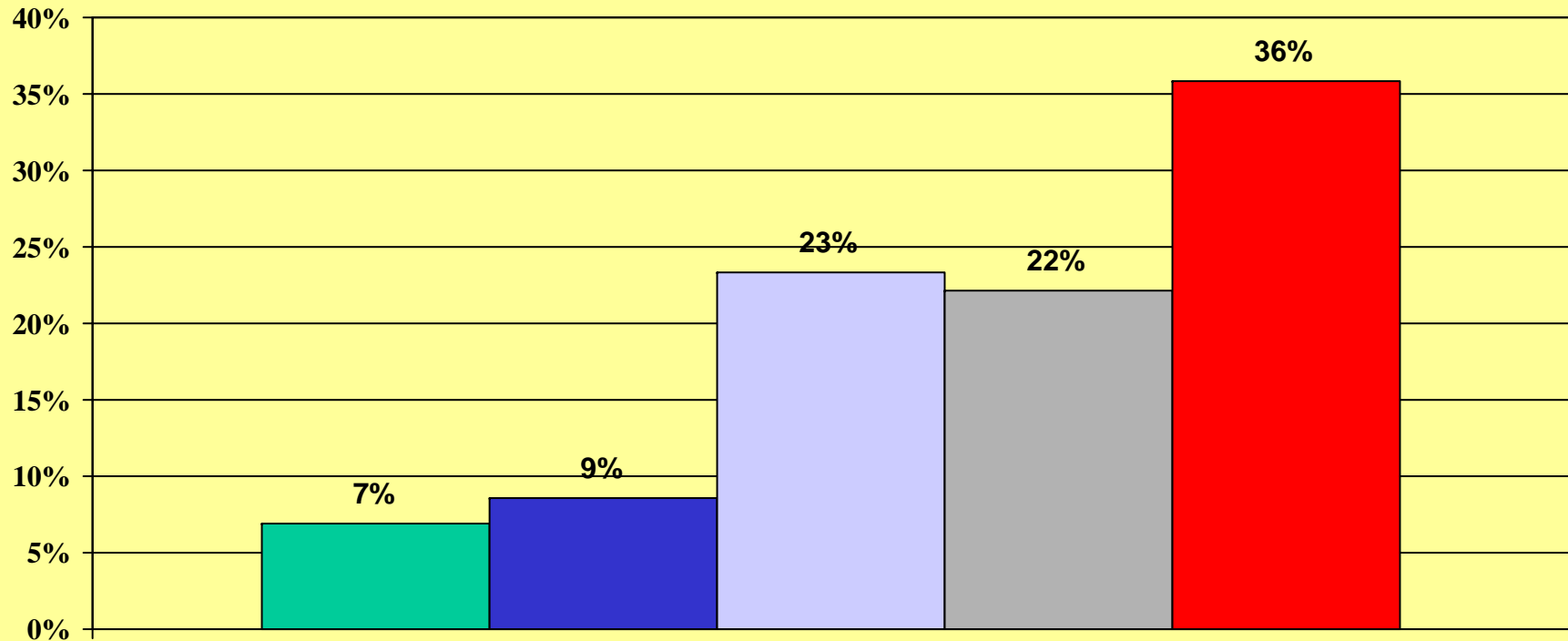

Political Philosophy

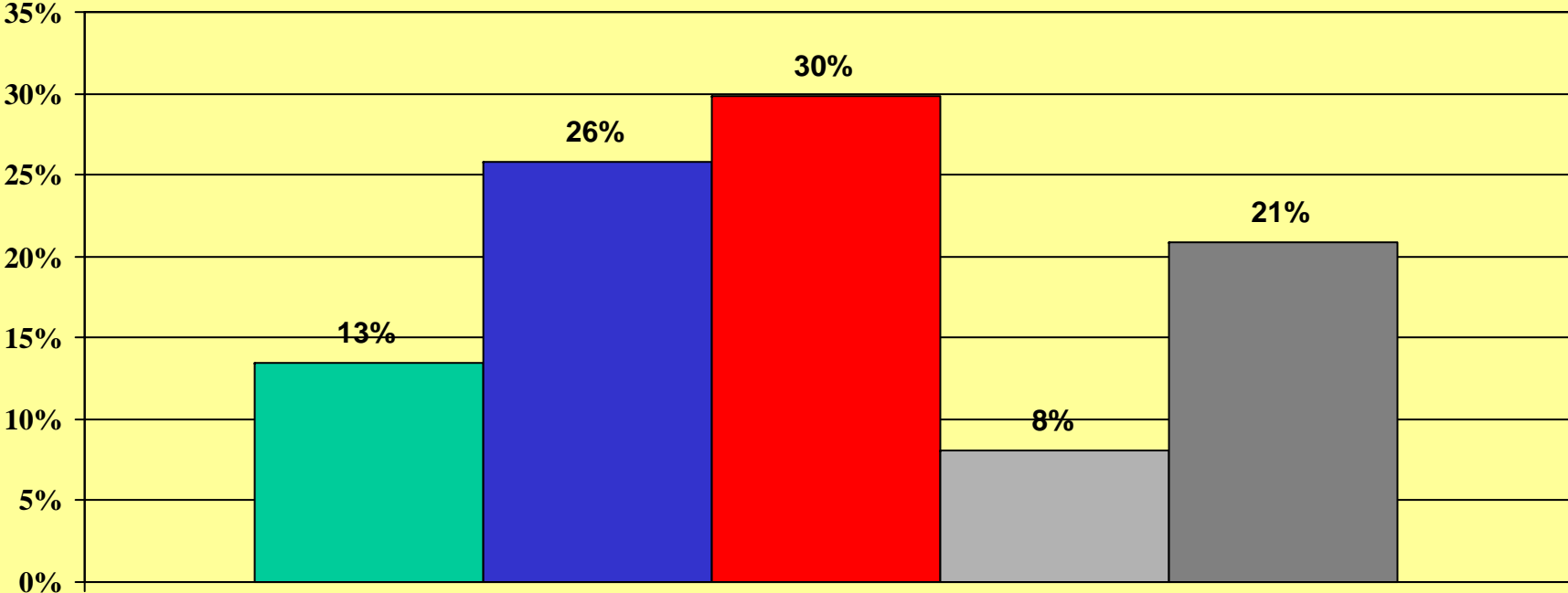

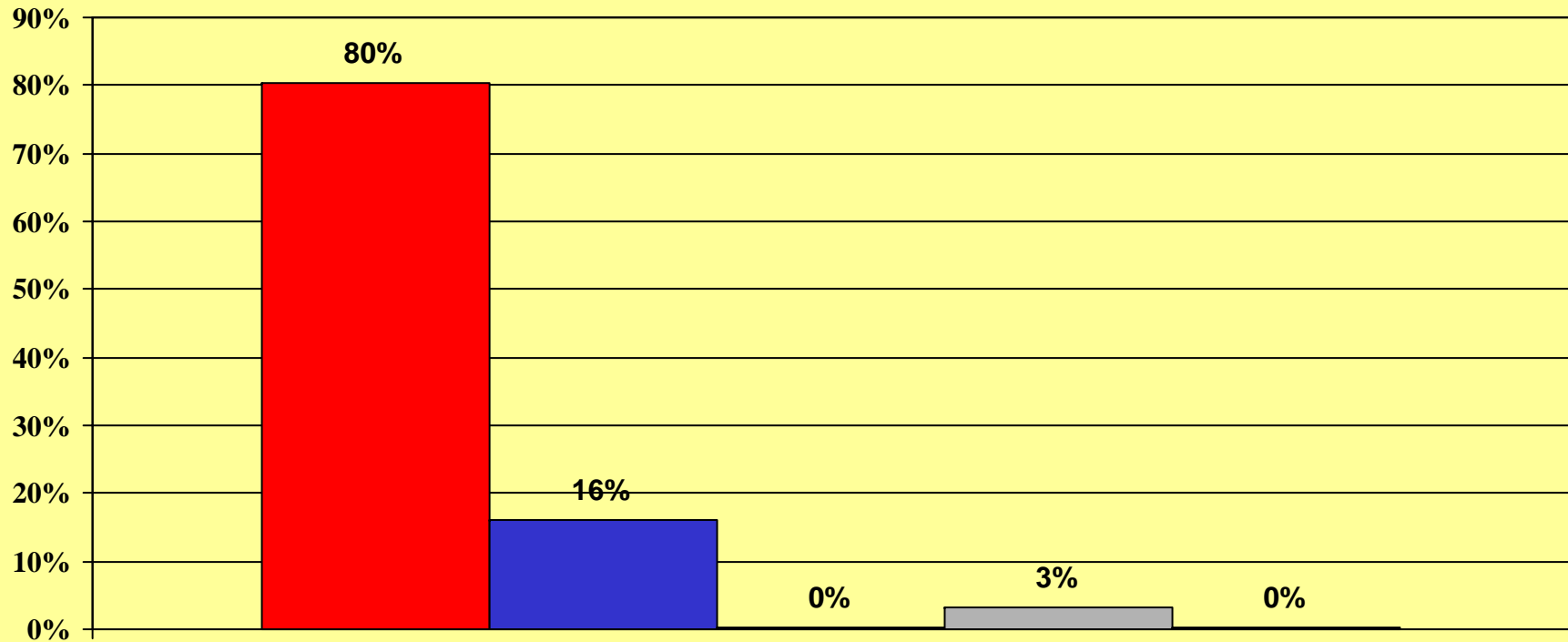

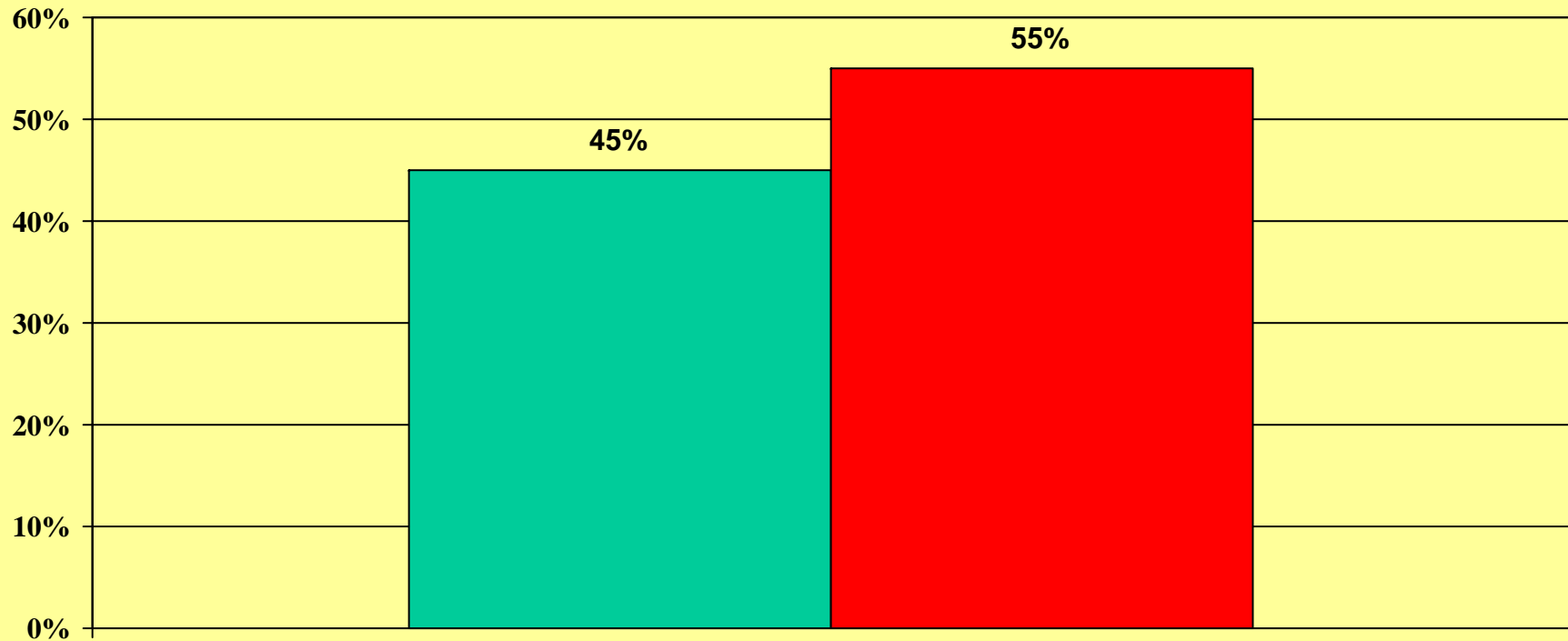

Gender

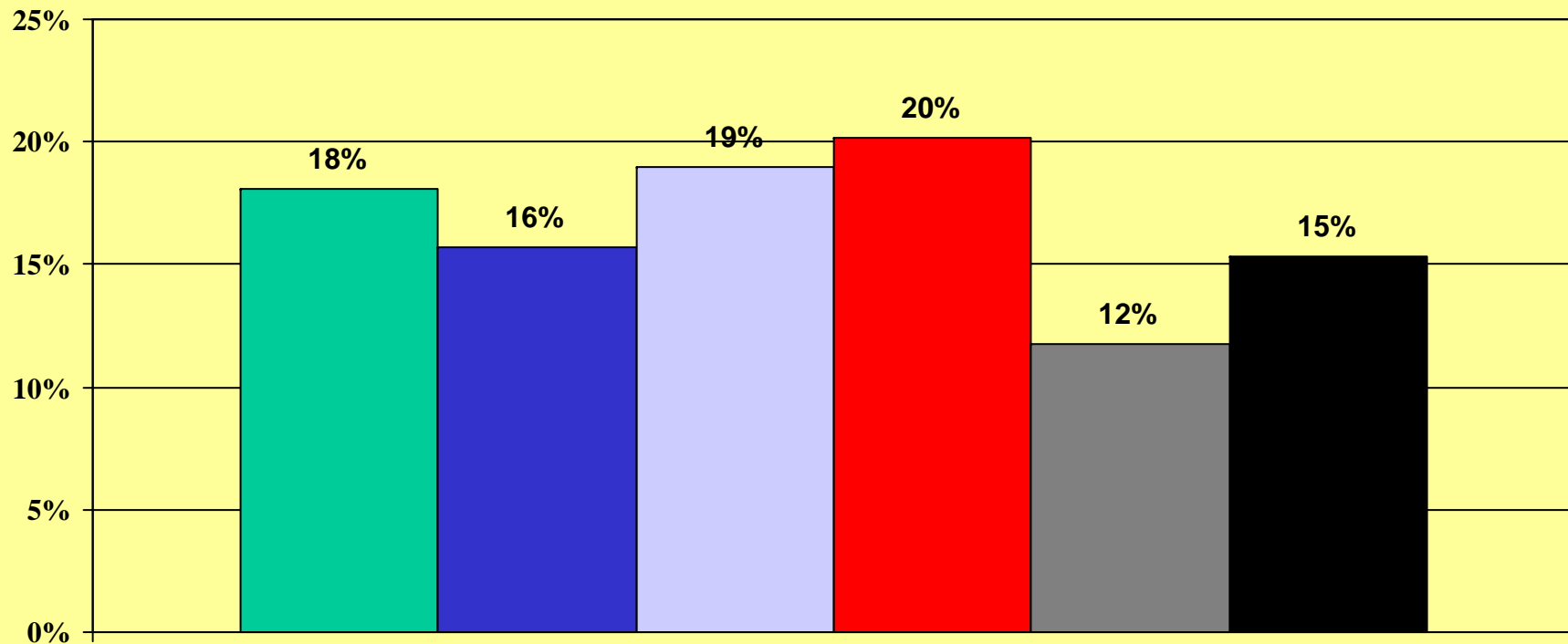
